#### “Living out our FAITH”

CHALLENGE NUMBER ONE:  
Memorize the following Bible verse:

Jesus said to him, “Away from me, Satan! For it is written: “worship the Lord your God, and serve Him only! Matthew 4:10
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In your lesson 10 supplement booklet entitled “The Deceiver” the bible basis discusses the devil’s nature and work. 1 John 3:6, Ephesians 2:2; 2 Corinthians 4:4; 11:14; 1 Peter 5:8 and Ephesians 6:11-12. Based on what you’ve read in the scriptures, write a short biography of Satan. Mention any past events and future happenings in the Bible in which Satan has had a part. You may also use the following scriptures: Matthew 4:1-11; Revelation 20:1-10; 2 Peter 2:4; Jude 6. If you do a search and put in Satan, you may find additional scriptures describing Satan.

CHALLENGE NUMBER TWO:  
Memorize the following Bible verse:

Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit – Ephesians 5:18 Don’t get drunk on wine, which leads to wild living. Instead, be filled with the Spirit – God’s Word Translation
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#### Lesson 11, “Live by the Spirit”

The aim of this lesson is that you choose to pursue a lifestyle that promotes spiritual growth instead of self-indulgence. Spiritual concerns and character should have first place in the Christian’s life. How can you, as a young adult, live by the spirit and not live wildly? Explain your plan of living below.

CHALLENGE NUMBER THREE:  
Memorize the following Bible Verse:

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom; all who follow His precepts have good understanding.  
Psalm 111:10a

The lesson aim of Lesson 12 is that students seek knowledge and wisdom from God and scripture. Lesson 12 also discusses and encourages us to have faith. Hebrews 11:1-13a explains **Faith**. Explain, in your own words, what Faith means to you!

CHALLENGE NUMBER FOUR:  
Study the following Bible verse

And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need you will abound in every good work.  
2 Corinthians 9:8

The Good News Translation says it this way; *And God is able to give you more than you need, so that you will always have all you need for yourselves and more than enough for every good cause.* This week's study wants us to learn the following – ALL THAT YOU CAN BE. Think about that. Make your plans to do just that.

CHALLENGE NUMBER FIVE:

Look at yourself, pray about it; if you aren't sure that you have accepted Christ as your personal Savior, study the plan; read the scriptures for the steps to become a Christian.
